The Rock

Well, it's no Stonehenge, but as some of you have noticed, we added a little landscaping at the office last fall. "The Rock" was discovered by Bryce Bosh back in the Summer of 2003 on County Road 44 right by the Gentley pit. To get it home we pushed it on the lowboy with a D6 Dozer. Once delivered to the site, we built a mound to place it on. We tried to lift it into place with the 980 loader. The rock weighed a lot (see trivia) and as we started to lift, it split in half from the pressure of the forks. Like Moses and the 10 commandments we were able to put the two huge puzzle pieces together. Then Ben Horken drilled some holes in the back side of the rock and used tie rods to pull it together. We found out that they make granite glue for these types of situations so we ordered some and patched it up like new. The engraving was done by G&J Stone Carving. They used a stencil and sandblasted the logo into place. They hand painted in the finishing touches. We then added the American flag, lighting, and landscaping that catches your eye as you turn into the office.

If you are getting out and blowing the dust off your power tools, here's a few things to remember from the Power Tool Institute: There are three main causes of power tool injuries, Loss of concentration, Unexpected Events, and Inexperience and Overconfidence.

Always remember power tool safety at work and at home.

- Check for power tools that are damaged or unsafe.
- Enforce use of proper ear, face, and body protection.
- Ensure that all blades and moving parts are guarded.
- Always follow the manufacturer's guidelines.
